Provided as the attachment is the Summary Report for APHO 122, Unit1 at the Former Marine Corps Air Station, El Toro. APHO 122 was identified by Science Applications International Corporation (SAIC) as an open storage area (SAIC anomaly 570) on an aerial photograph taken on 20 August 1955. Two large open storage areas that are surrounded by chain-link fences are addressed as APHO 122, Unit 1. A railroad spur is located adjacent to the two large open storage areas. Stained soils that are located at the former railroad loading dock area will be addressed separately as APHO 122, Unit 2.

Based upon the results of the field sampling activities that were conducted during August 2005 and the screening risk evaluation, we are recommending no further action for APHO 122, Unit 1 with Environmental Condition of Property (ECP) category 3.
