**CLOSURE EXTENSION: MARINE CORPS AIR STATION EL TORO,
EL TORO, CALIFORNIA (EPA ID NO. CA6170023208)**

The Department of Toxic Substances Control (Department) has received your letter dated December 21, 1994 regarding the closure of the hazardous waste storage facility (Building 673-T3) at Marine Corps Air Station (MCAS) El Toro. On December 14, 1994, the Department directed MCAS El Toro to commence and complete closure operations within 90 and 180 days, respectively, from August 18, 1994. MCAS El Toro is requesting a 180-day extension to both deadlines due to staffing and budget limitations.

The Department hereby grants from the date of this letter, 60 days to begin and 180 days to complete closure operations, provided that MCAS El Toro submits prior to January 31, 1995:

1. written verification that all hazardous waste has been removed from the hazardous waste storage area; and
2. a schedule of closure activities for Building 673-T3.

The Department may consider additional extensions of these due dates based on the above submittal. Please be aware that further extensions will require a permit modification in accordance with California Code of Regulations, Title 22, Division 4.5, Section 66264.113(c) and 66270.42.
