MAY 25, 2000**

These minutes summarize the discussions and presentations from the RAB meeting held at the Bayview Police Station (201 Williams Street) between 6:00 p.m. and 7:27 p.m. on Thursday, May 25, 2000. A verbatim transcript was also prepared for the meeting and will be posted on the Hunters Point Shipyard web page and included in the Information Repository and Administrative Record file for Hunters Point Shipyard (HPS). Welcome/Introductions/Agenda Review

Mr. Richard Mach, BRAC Environmental Coordinator and Navy RAB Co-chair, brought the meeting to order at 6:08 p.m. All in attendance made self-introductions.

Old Business/Approval of Meeting Minutes from March 23, 2000

The RAB Co-chairs did not have any old business to discuss. The April 27, 2000 meeting minutes were approved as submitted. Mr. Mach showed a copy of the transcript from the April 27, 2000 meeting to the RAB attendees. Copies of the meeting transcripts will be placed in the Information Repository and the Administrative Record and will be included on the HPS web site.

Announcements

Mr. Mach announced that the HPS web page has been established. He presented an overhead showing how the main web page appears and included the web site address: <http://www.efds.w.navy.mil/dep/env/PAGES/hpoint.htm>. The web site currently includes the February and March meeting minutes. The meeting minutes and transcript for the April 27, 2000 meeting will also be placed on the web site the first week of May 2000.

Mr. Mach informed the RAB attendees that he would be making the presentations that Mr. David DeMars was scheduled to make since Mr. DeMars is out of town due to a death in the family.

Ms. Amy Brownell announced that she would not be attending RAB meetings for the next 7 months. In her absence, Mr. Jesse Blout and Mr. Byron Rhett will represent the City of San Francisco at the RAB meetings.

Community Reports

Ms. Jill Fox, RAB Community Co-chair, provided community announcements. She said that a rally had been held at noon today at the Federal building and that it had been quite successful. It was expected to be shown on the 10 o'clock news on Channel 2. Also, the Third Street Fair will be held on July 29 and 30, 2000 in the Hunters Point neighborhood. Ms. Fox felt that it would be a good avenue of community outreach and either the RAB, Navy, or its contractors should have a booth at the fair. The cost of an outreach booth is \$500 for the weekend. It is a fundraiser for the Sojourner Truth Family Resource Center, a worthy cause.

Community Outreach

Mr. Mach reported that the Navy is moving ahead with the quarterly newsletter. The Navy has reviewed several drafts that were prepared by the contractor and it is still scheduled for distribution on June 8, 2000.

Mr. Mach said that the Navy provided a brief at the last meeting, on May 18, 2000, of the Project Area Committee (PAC) and a similar brief is planned for the upcoming meeting of the Citizen's Advisory Committee (CAC), which is scheduled for June 12, 2000.

In response to Ms. Fox's inquiry, Mr. Mach explained that some dignitaries from the Department of the Navy and Department of Defense came to San Francisco earlier this week and met with the Mayor's staff to discuss HPS as well as some other San Francisco area bases. On Tuesday, May 23, 2000, the following personnel toured HPS: Mr. Mach, Ms. Elsie Munsell, Mr. Bill Cassidy, and Mr. Robin Pirie with the Navy; Mr. Randall Yim with Department of Defense; Mr. Matt Bennett with the White House staff; and Mr. Jesse Blout and Mr. Byron Rhett, with the City of San Francisco. The Navy provided an update on the status of the cleanup process. The group also discussed ways to expedite the cleanup at HPS, including Parcel B. Mr. Mach said that the Navy is looking at doing additional interim actions to speed up the Superfund process, such as removal actions, including soil removal and fuel distribution lines and steam line closure at Parcels C and D, cesium spill cleanup at Parcels D and E, and completing the groundwater data gaps analysis.

Technical Assistance for Public Participation (TAPP) Grant for Parcel B Land Use Control Implementation Plan (LUCIP) - Update

Mr. Mach reported that the Navy has received, and his Commanding Officer should have signed today, the application that Ms. Shirley and Ms. Fox prepared to have an outside expert review the LUCIP for Parcel B. The Navy hopes to award the TAPP grant by June 6, 2000. As one of the ways to expedite the cleanup/closure process, the schedule for the LUCIP has been accelerated. The current, expedited schedule has the LUCIP finalized on September 7, 2000 as opposed to November 4, 2000, a reduction of about 2 months. Mr. Mach mentioned that the request for proposal (RFP) to review the LUCIP should be sent out by the Navy this week. Ms. Fox stated that the next RAB meeting agenda should include time to present the results of the LUCIP review.

Ms. Shirley requested that Mr. Olin Webb, Bayview Community Advocates, be sent a copy of RFP. Mr. Mach responded that the Navy has his address and will send him a copy of the RFP.

Planning Discussion for the June 3, 2000 CAC/PAC Meeting

Ms. Fox informed everyone that since the last RAB meeting she has spent a fair amount of time doing community outreach involving the CAC and PAC. It was suggested at some meetings of the CAC and PAC that the RAB be involved in a joint meeting to provide the community with an update and overview of the cleanup at HPS. As a result of these discussions it was decided that the CAC and PAC would co-sponsor a workshop from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. on Saturday, June 3, 2000 at the Earl P. Mills Community Center located at 100 Whitney Young Circle in the community of Bayview/Hunters Point. The workshop will include informed community groups and will provide attendees with an open format to learn about what has happened and is happening at HPS. Background information on the environmental cleanup program would be presented to the attendees. Then, a follow-up meeting would be planned during the time of the regularly scheduled monthly RAB meeting from 5:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. on Thursday, June 22, 2000. The follow-up meeting would be in lieu of the June 22, 2000 RAB meeting. The Navy will not be attending the June 3, 2000 meeting, but they plan on attending the June 22, 2000 meeting. The June 22, 2000 meeting is scheduled to be held at the Southeast Community Center, which can accommodate a large number of people.

Ms. Fox asked that the RAB approve co-sponsoring the June 3, 2000 and June 22, 2000 meetings. Some concern was raised about including all the topics needed to be discussed during the CAC/PAC/RAB meeting and some felt that a short regular meeting before the CAC/PAC/RAB meeting might be able to address the RAB topics. Mr. Mach explained that the Navy provided a letter to the CAC in which they proposed including the topics of concern in the next two RAB meetings. The CAC did not agree with this approach in place of the proposed meeting on June 3, 2000 and decided to proceed with the June 3, 2000 community meeting. The CAC also did not want to have the meeting at a later date for several reasons. Ms. Fox suggested to the CAC and PAC that the RAB co-sponsor these meetings and that the CAC/PAC/RAB meeting be held on June 22, 2000 in place of the RAB meeting to alleviate the time commitment of the community members that are involved. The RAB voted to approve co-sponsoring these meetings and have the CAC/PAC/RAB June 22, 2000 meeting in place of the regularly-

scheduled RAB meeting, while ensuring important RAB topics be included in the agenda, especially the TAPP presentation.

Parcel B Update

Mr. Mach gave the presentation in Mr. DeMars absence. The Parcel B Update has been on the RAB meeting agendas for the past 6 or 7 months.

Mr. Mach explained that the ROD goals for Parcel B are unchanged. To accomplish this, the Navy will be excavating contaminated sites using a residential risk scenario to ensure that they are protective and allow unrestricted reuse (including allowing residents to grow produce) down to a depth of 10 feet. An Explanation of Significant Differences (ESD) for the Parcel B ROD was prepared by the Navy to simply update the cleanup goals to match/incorporate 1999 U.S. EPA's Preliminary Remediation Goals (PRGs) and a revised nickel background level.

Mr. Mach said the Navy has been working closely with the regulatory agencies to draft the ESD; the ESD was sent to the BCT and the public on April 10, 2000 for review. The Navy incorporated responses to comments for the Final ESD and finalized it on May 10, 2000. The ESD Public Notice was placed in area newspapers. The Navy is currently in the field collecting samples to be used in delineating the areas of contamination. The Navy is also preparing a sampling and analysis plan (SAP). The Navy and the regulatory agencies are continuing to discuss ways to accelerate the cleanup.

In response to Ms. Fox's inquiry about the additional truck traffic in the neighborhood areas, Mr. Mach said that they would follow the same plan with the same kinds of restrictions that were previously adhered to. In response to a RAB attendees question regarding the amount of the sampling and analysis budget, Mr. Mach responded that it was a couple hundred thousand dollars. Ms. Trombadore requested that information on the cleanup at Parcel B be included in the upcoming newsletter, Mr. Mach agreed.

Parcel D Risk Management Review (RMR) Process Update

Mr. Mach gave the presentation on behalf of Mr. DeMars. Mr. Mach mentioned that a new remedial project manager for the Navy will be involved in Parcel D, his name is Mr. Dale Altshul.

Mr. Mach said that Parcel D was used for industrial and commercial uses. The reuse plan is calling industrial used in the majority of the property with a small portion slated for mixed use, which includes residential uses. The Navy is planning to cleanup the majority of the property to the most stringent industrial standard and is currently leaning toward a residential use scenario in the mixed use area. As part of the RMR, the Navy reviewed all of the data and compared it to the 1998 PRGs to determine which sites require remediation. The Draft RMR Report is due to the regulatory agencies on June 20, 2000. After the RMR is complete, there will still be groundwater issues to review. As discussed at the previous RAB meeting, a groundwater investigation will still be conducted. Mr. Mach said that the Navy is looking at ways to expedite the cleanup of Parcel D, similar to what has been done for Parcel B. It is expected that Parcel D fieldwork will be conducted following the Parcel B fieldwork. Parcel C will follow, however, there is some volatile organic compound (VOC) contamination that must be addressed in a

different manner. The Navy will also be removing the fuel distribution and steam lines. Ms. Shirley noted that the steam lines had in the past been used to carry illegal materials and Mr. Mach agreed and pointed out that this was not done by the Navy but by tenants on HPS property. A RAB attendee asked what was found in the steam lines on Parcel B, Ms. Trombadore responded that nothing was found.

Technical Assistance Grant (TAG) Update

Ms. Fox reported that Mr. Alex Lantsberg was unable to attend the RAB meeting. The TAG contractor will be present at the June 3, 2000 and June 22, 2000 CAC/PAC/RAB meetings.

Future Agenda Topics

A CAC/PAC/RAB community meeting will be held in lieu of the regular monthly RAB scheduled for June 22, 2000. The RAB meeting agenda will be modified to fit in the time for the CAC/PAC/RAB community meeting. It was suggested that a HPS tour should be scheduled in place of a RAB meeting during one of the summer meetings. Although additional agenda topics may be determined after this meeting, the additional agenda topics for the July 27, 2000 RAB meeting may include:

- TAPP status for LUCIP review
- Parcel B Update
- Discussion of RAB Co-chair elections
