1. Actions Taken During Previous Calendar Month:

- A. All draft work plans have now been submitted to the applicable regulatory agencies for review and comment. The Navy is still awaiting comments on the following draft work plans:
- a. Sampling Plan, Group IV
  - b. Data Management Plan
  - c. Project Management Plan
  - d. Feasibility Study Plan

2. Actions Expected to be or have been Undertaken During Current Calendar Month:

- A. The following investigative tasks have been conducted to provide supportive information for the Remedial Investigation:
- a. Geophysical test program
  - b. Geophysical surveys
  - c. Topographic and grid surveying
  - d. Surface radiation survey

A letter report summarizing the geophysical program is being prepared and will be submitted to the applicable regulatory agencies, when it becomes available.

- B. The following investigative tasks are currently being performed to provide supportive information for the Remedial Investigation:
- a. Drilling of pilot borings
  - b. Off-Site well survey
  - c. Drilling of shallow borings at selected Group II Sites.
- C. The final phase of the PCB Removal Action near former Building 503 is near completion. Backfill and encapsulation of excavation was completed in September 1988. Asphalt capping of area to be implemented soon. Land title notification for the area is being established. The On-Scene Coordinator summary report is being prepared.

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- D. Implementation of the Supplement to the Air Sampling Plan (Solid Waste Air Quality Assessment Test) is in progress.
  - E. Bench-scale testing is being planned for the pile of hazardous sandblast grit on the Bay Fill Area at HPA to render it nonhazardous. After completion of the bench-scale testing, a workplan will be prepared describing the proposed implementation of the treatment program for the sandblast waste.
  - F. A proposed reconnaissance sample plan to characterize stormwater runoff has been submitted for regulatory review.
