Dear Mr. Hinton:

We understand the Department is interested in opening the Technical Review Committee (TRC) meetings to the general public. We feel this will conflict with the intended purpose of TRCs.

The legal requirement, 10 U.S.C. §2705 (c), for TRCs reads as follows:

"Whenever possible and practical, the Secretary shall establish a technical review committee to review and comment on Department of Defense actions and proposed actions with respect to releases or threatened releases of hazardous substances at installations. Members of any such committee shall include at least one representative of the Secretary, the Administrator, and appropriate State and local authorities and shall include a public representative of the community involved."

We typically go beyond the minimal legal requirements. Representatives of the community that do participate in TRCs are local environmental groups, community planning groups, and local associations.

Our internal policy recommends the number of committee members be "limited to a manageable number"; that public representatives should be selected on their "technical qualifications rather than their political or activist status in the community"; and that "TRC meetings are not public meetings and should not be recorded or transcribed."

Although the TRC is intended to solicit input from a public representative of the community, its primary purpose is the discussion of often complex technical issues. At these meetings, sometimes controversial or potential emotional subjects can be approached objectively and scientifically. Opening the TRC to the general public may disrupt and further slow down the CERCLA process.

While we agree with priority the Department places upon community input, we believe the CERCLA process and the community will be better served by keeping the TRC and community relations processes separate. We do not intend to open the TRC to the general public. I am willing to discuss this issue with you if you feel our position is not acceptable to your Department.
