LONG BEACH NAVAL COMPLEX

REMOVAL OF CONTAMINATED SOIL AT THE FORMER NAVAL STATION INSTALLATION RESTORATION SITE 3, AREA OF CONCERN 4

Naval Facilities Engineering Command, Southwest Division is requesting public comment on a proposal to cleanup soil contamination on the Naval Station's Installation Restoration Site 3, Area of Concern (AOC) 4. Site 3, AOC 4 is contaminated with elevated levels of arsenic in the surface soils and the preferred cleanup option is excavation and removal. This cleanup option, along with other alternatives evaluated, are described in a report called an Engineering Evaluation/Cost Analysis (EE/CA)

Site 3, AOC was characterized during a Remedial Investigation prepared under the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act. It is estimated that 15 cubic yards of soil, with a maximum depth of one foot, will be excavated and properly removed off base to an approved disposal facility. Clean soil will replace the soil that has been removed.
