
Dear Mr. Wang:

This letter acknowledges your letter dated October 22, 1993 concerning the establishment of a Renovation Advisory Board (RAB).

The Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) process involves Naval Station Long Beach, not Long Beach Naval Shipyard (LBNSY). The corrective/cleanup action being conducted at the Shipyard is being done as a condition of our Resource Conservation Recovery Act (RCRA), Part B permit, and not as a prelude to closure. Additionally, we are reviewing the merits of establishing a RAB in lieu of the Technical Review Committee. We will be seeking guidance from Southwest Division, Naval Facilities Engineering Command and Naval Sea Systems Command prior to making a decision.

Thank you for keeping us informed of the Department of Toxic Substances Control Base Closure and Conversion activities and for making your staff available to assist in implementing and facilitating the RAB, if the Shipyard decides to follow this program.
