

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15 DECEMBER 1987 - STATUS OF HW ACTIONS AT NAVAL AIR STATION, MOFFETT FIELD

The Navy is submitting a Work Plan, Sampling Plan, SWAT, Quality Assurance Project Plan and Health and Safety Plan under separate cover. These planning documents are in accordance with EPA procedures and will be submitted to regulatory agencies by 15 December 1987.

A tour was given to EPA's consultants, Metcalf and Eddy, on 9 December 1987.

Kennedy/Jenks/Chilton has finished the initial fieldwork and majority of the geophysical search to locate potential groundwater conduits. The technical report of the record search is on schedule and will be submitted by 15 January 1988.

The Navy is awaiting final lab results for the flux ponds. Preliminary results indicate that the ponds do not contain or receive hazardous waste as defined in Article 11 of title 22 of the CAC. Since the liquid in the ponds is not hazardous waste, it is not subject to TPCA. A report on the the flux ponds will be submitted to regulatory agencies by 1 January 1988. Dames and Moore is working on the Report of Waste Discharge and Closure Plan for the flux ponds.

A Tank Monitoring Proposal will be submitted to the regulatory agencies by 31 December 1987.
