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INSTALLATION RESTORATION PROGRAM (IRP)
MONTHLY STATUS/ACTION REPORT
15 APRIL 1988

1. On 22 March 1988, Mr. Gordon Davidson of Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Headquarters, Washington, D. C., visited Naval Air Station (NAS) Moffett Field. He was shown our Remedial Investigation sites and given a status report on our cleanup progress.
2. On 29 March 1988, NAS Moffett Field hired Mr. Michael Cain in the new position of Environmental Coordinator. He is now the Station's point of contact for Installation Restoration and other matters regarding Environmental Protection. He represents the Commanding Officer and presents Command positions at meetings, conferences, and hearings with public and municipal, state, regional and Federal authorities on environmental protection matters. 3. The final investigation report of our Industrial Wastewater Flux Ponds was submitted to the California Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB) on 30 March 1988. The investigation revealed that the ponds do not receive or contain hazardous waste.
4. On 4 April 1988 we met with the EPA, Western Division, Naval Facilities Engineering Command, the Department of Health Services, the CRWQCB and our IRP contractor to review and expand our potential conduit study to include horizontal potential conduits.
5. The Solid Waste Assessment Testwork Plan (Volume III) and the Quality Assurance Project Plan (Volume IV) were completed 30 March 1988. The Final Work Plan (all volumes) is still under development by the contractor. The Final Work Plan had to be approved by 1 March 1988 to meet the 15 March 1988 milestone and begin remedial investigations. We are still negotiating on some of the early comments made by the EPA and the CRWQCB. Field activities will begin when all volumes of the Final Work Plan are delivered to the EPA and the CRWQCB, and the final Quality Assurance Project Plan (Volume IV) is approved by the EPA.
