**Subject: RAB MEETING MINUTES**

The Moffett Federal Airfield Restoration Advisory Board (RAB) meeting was held on Thursday, 10 May 2001, in the Mountain View Police Department's auditorium. Ms. Andrea Muckerman, Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) Environmental Coordinator (BEC) and Navy RAB Co-chair opened the meeting at 7:17 p.m.

**WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS**

Ms. Muckerman thanked the attendees for coming and informed everybody of the handouts that had been made available at the meeting. The Moffett Field RAB meeting was attended by:

**Review Agenda:** Attendees were asked to review the evening's agenda and decide whether any items needed to be added. A Western Aquifer Treatment System (WATS) status report was added to the agenda upon RAB member, Jim McClure's request. Mr. McClure also pointed out that the time stated on the agenda for the Technical, Historical, and Educational (THE) subcommittee meeting was incorrect. He clarified that the subcommittee meets at 7 p.m. (not 5 p.m.) on the day prior to each RAB meeting.

**Approval of Minutes:** Ms. Muckerman solicited comments on the minutes from the 15 February 2001 RAB meeting. Mr. McClure noted that the third line of the first full paragraph on page two should read as follows – "(H)owever, he felt that an agency comment letter should not have come before receiving the report." The minutes were approved unanimously with the above change.

Mr. Lenny Siegel put forth a motion that the meeting minutes document the name of each speaker so that comments can be traced back to the correct person. All present voted in favor of the motion.

**Documents for Review:** Ms. Muckerman inquired about the efficacy of the document distribution technique. Mr. Siegel requested that, to the extent possible, the documents should be sent via U.S. mail since FedEx requires recipient signatures, which could cause unnecessary delays. In addition, it was agreed that RAB members whose contact information is recorded on the sign-in sheet, need only put their names on the document sign-up sheets and not their entire address.

## REGULATORY UPDATE

Ms. Muckerman invited the attending regulatory agency representatives to introduce themselves to the RAB.

- John Hamill, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA): Mr. Hamill introduced himself as the new Remedial Project Manager (RPM) for Moffett Field. He will be filling this position until a permanent RPM is named. He informed the members that his past experience has been with projects pertaining to property transfers and base closures.
- Adriana Constantinescu, California Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB), San Francisco Bay Region: Dr. Lynn Suer will be taking a leave of absence starting 15 June 2001, and a new RPM will be assigned to Moffett Field in the near future. In the interim, Ms. Constantinescu will serve in that capacity and will also assist with the transition.

Ms. Constantinescu stated that she works with the groundwater protection/waste containment division of the RWQCB. She has over 19 years of professional experience as a geologist and has been with Region 2 of the RWQCB for 3 months. She is presently serving as the project manager on several projects including Point Molate and the petroleum sites at Moffett Field.

- Dave Cooper, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA): Ms. Muckerman also introduced Mr. Cooper to the attendees.

## **SITE STATUS UPDATE**

**Western Aquifer Treatment System (WATS):** This system treats Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs) in groundwater and requires monthly monitoring of effluent. Preliminary tests detected that levels of acetone exceed required levels. However, secondary testing has verified that the acetone is not coming from the groundwater. The Navy is presently in the process of isolating the cause of the excess acetone and resolving the issue of bringing it down to required levels. This process will probably carry through until the month of June. Stanford University's enhanced natural attenuation program has been postponed until WATS is back online.

**Site 22, Golf Course Landfill:** Mr. Wilson Doctor, the Site 22 Remedial Project Manager (RPM) from Southwest Division, presented an update on the Site 22 Proposed Plan. After reviewing the background information on the site and the different alternatives discussed in the proposed plan, Mr. Doctor shared with the RAB public comments that had been received in the course of the public comment period. These included:

- The project's impact on Navy budget.
- The cost of the preferred alternative. Some think that it might be excessive.
- Golf course representatives are concerned over their loss of revenue.
- Loss of trees.
- Groundwater infiltration.
- Possibility of squirrels burrowing even after the preferred alternative is implemented.
- Ecological concerns about the nesting of predatory birds.
- Some members of the public believe that the no-action alternative should be adopted.
- Site excavation should be explored so that restrictions on future land use can be minimized.
- The biotic barrier should cover the entire 9.4 acres of the landfill.

In response to questions from attendees, Mr. Doctor said that approximately an equal number of comments were received in writing and orally.

RAB members were informed that the Responsiveness Summary will be available for public review starting 25 June 2001. Mr. McClure inquired whether the meeting transcript would be made available any sooner than 25 June, and Ms. Muckerman said that she would get back to him with that information.

**Site 25, Eastern Diked Marsh & Storm Water Retention Pond:** Ms. Angela Patterson, the Site 25 RPM from Southwest Division, asked for a confirmation on whether those

present had received a copy of the Revised Final Response to Comments on the Revised Final Feasibility Study. She informed the members that the draft proposed plan was under review by the regulators until 29 May 2001. The public comment period for the proposed plan will be observed from 23 July to 22 August 2001. A meeting to solicit public comments has been scheduled for 2 August 2001.

Ms. Patterson briefly reviewed the various components of the preferred alternative for Site 25. These include excavation and offsite disposal of the top 1 foot of sediment, testing to confirm efficacy of the remedy, reestablishing the natural habitat and enacting institutional controls to ensure that seasonal drying continues to occur and that natural processes are not disturbed.

Mr. Siegel expressed concern about the "institutional controls" aspect of the preferred alternative. He stated that old photographs offer hints of the area being a natural wetland and efforts should be directed toward restoring that natural habitat. Ms. Muckerman clarified that the NASA was responsible for management and use of the facility and that the Navy was not involved in that capacity. The Navy's role is restricted to cleanup activity and restoring the site to its existing use. Mr. Siegel stated that he only wanted to ensure that nothing in the Navy's cleanup should prevent NASA from restoring the tidal wetland. Ms. Patterson thanked the members for their useful input and said that the Navy would get back to the RAB once the issue of institutional controls was evaluated in greater detail.

**Site 27, Northern Channel:** The Northern Channel stretches from the Building 191 pump station to the Lockheed pump station. The Navy was supposed to submit the Draft Feasibility Study for Site 27 by 15 March 2001. However, while conducting the internal review it was felt that the Navy did not have enough data for a detailed site characterization and that more surface and subsurface samples were needed to conduct an accurate ecological risk assessment. In light of that, a letter was submitted to the regulatory agencies requesting additional time. The U.S. EPA and the Water Board did not concur with the request and asked for additional reasoning on why it was needed. Ms. Patterson stated that the issue is presently at the informal dispute level and hopefully further resolution will be reached during a conference call with the regulators next Thursday, 17 May 2001.

Mr. McClure inquired about the anticipated length of the project. He was told that the start of the project dates back to late 1998 when NASA decided not to dredge the Northern Channel for flood control. The project's conclusion will depend upon discussions with the agencies and the Navy will probably have a more definite answer by the next RAB meeting. RAB members were informed that they would be notified of any changes that would be made to the Federal Facilities Agreement (FFA) as a result of negotiations with regulators. Mr. McClure asked if there was any enforcement mechanism that could be invoked if the Navy is not able to come to an agreement with the regulators. He was informed that if that were the case, the dispute would go from informal dispute resolution to formal dispute resolution. Further, if no agreement is

reached, it would go through different levels of management to the U.S. EPA Administrator.

Mr. Siegel added that since the Northern Channel extends south of the Navy's property, other property owners, such as Lockheed, should also be asked to sample for contamination.

**Moffett Community Housing:** This project pertains to groundwater investigations underway at two community housing areas on and adjacent to Moffett Field. An open house was held on 3 May 2001 to provide residents with an update on groundwater and to answer their questions. Four residents attended the open house. For the RAB's information, Ms. Patterson reviewed the various documents that were handed out at the meeting. They are:

- Road map of poster stations (agenda)
- Mailing list sign-up cards
- RAB application form
- Points of contact for the Navy, the regulatory bodies and the information repository
- Addresses of relevant Internet sites
- Schedule of events
- Comment forms
- Moffett Community Housing Groundwater Update fact sheet
- Frequently Asked Questions
- Meeting evaluation form
- Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry (ATSDR) handouts on chemicals that have been detected in the groundwater
- Posters on Volatile Organic Compounds, Baseline Risk Assessment, Determine How Exposure Could Occur, Preliminary Risk Evaluation, Initial Site Discovery, Site Characterization, Overestimation of Potential Risks, Agency Partnership, and Timeline of Activities

RAB members were informed that the workplan for the Moffett Community Housing fieldwork is scheduled to be completed by November-December 2001. Fieldwork will ensue in the months of December 2001 and January 2002. Subsequently site characterization will be conducted and documents will be submitted to the regulatory agencies for review. Members raised questions about why the workplan would not be initiated until later this year. Ms. Patterson explained that the groundwater data shows that there is no imminent danger to residents and, therefore, there is no need to accelerate the site characterization process.

Mr. Siegel inquired about the risk range that was applied and Mr. Michael Stanley-Jones requested that the risk evaluation model that was used be presented to the RAB. Ms. Patterson said that the Navy used U.S. EPA's standard risk range and that the

Johnson and Adler model used for the preliminary risk evaluation is available at the Department of Toxic Substances Control's website.

Several RAB members shared the following comments:

- Mr. Siegel noted that Moffett Community Housing could bring forth new blood for the RAB since its residents are directly impacted by the groundwater investigation. He also expressed concern over the different issues pertaining to the contamination - how would cleanup be implemented if it is found that the source is outside of Navy property and does the risk assessment model look at future toxic impacts of contamination?
- Mr. Stanley-Jones stressed the need for the risk screening model to evaluate the possibility and impact of dermal contact and ingestion of contaminants.
- Mr. Tom Mohr requested that stringent measures be taken to determine what concentrations of VOCs are problematic and what their rate of movement is expected to be.

Ms. Patterson assured the attendees that all these questions would be addressed during the formulation of the workplan and as a part of the site characterization. Ms. Muckerman thanked Ms. Patterson for her update. She then introduced Ms. Mary Parker, the Site 1 and 2 RPM from Southwest Division.

**Operable Unit 1, Site 1 & 2 Landfills:** Sites 1 & 2 are presently undergoing post remedial action monitoring. The Record of Decision was signed in August 1997, subsequent to which Site 2 wastes were excavated and consolidated into Site 1, which was then capped. The construction was completed in November 1998. Currently quarterly monitoring and inspection is conducted at the site by the Santa Clara County. No issues were identified in the last inspection report. Interested RAB members were asked to sign up for the upcoming documents related to this project. Responding to a question by Mr. Bob Moss, Ms. Parker said that the monitoring includes evaluating whether gas is migrating off site. She said that given the good progress and track record, reducing the frequency of monitoring might also be looked into.

#### **SUBCOMMITTEE REPORT**

Ms. Muckerman asked Mr. McClure to provide a synopsis of the 9 May 2001 THE meeting. Mr. McClure stated that three key items were discussed:

- The renewed look at salt and stabilizer chemicals. Mr. Tom Mohr will deliver a paper on the subject in June.
- The Site 22 Proposed Plan and comments received.
- Acetone detection in the WATS over the last year.

Mr. McClure also informed everybody that the Santa Clara Valley Water District symposium on "Characterization and Remediation of Emerging and Recalcitrant Contaminants" on 14 and 15 June 2001 has been moved to the Wyndham San Jose Hotel.

## **RAB BUSINESS**

**Next RAB Meeting:** It was agreed that the next RAB meeting would be held on **Thursday, 9 August 2001**, from 7 to 9 p.m.

# MOFFETT FEDERAL AIRFIELD RESTORATION ADVISORY BOARD MEMBERSHIP APPLICATION

The Department of Defense (DOD) recognizes the importance of stakeholder participation in our Installation Restoration Programs (IRP). Therefore, Moffett Federal Airfield has established a Restoration Advisory Board (RAB). The RAB is intended to improve public participation by involving the community in the Navy's environmental restoration decision-making process. All RAB meetings are open to the public.

The RAB includes community volunteer members who reflect the diverse interests of the local community. RAB members serve as a liaison with the community and are available to meet with community members and groups. RAB members have an opportunity to provide input on installation restoration activities. RAB members spend a fairly significant amount of time each year supporting the RAB. The RAB meets regularly and reviews and comments on plans and activities relating to the ongoing environmental studies and restoration activities at Moffett Federal Airfield. Members will be expected to serve a full term.


