ADDITIONAL STUDIES AT MOFFETT COMMUNITY HOUSING



The next meeting of the former NAS Moffett Field is scheduled for July 10, 2003. Among other things, the Navy will present information on the additional studies that are going to be conducted at Moffett Community Housing.

TCE was detected in indoor and outdoor air at Moffett Community Housing during recent Navy investigations. The levels of TCE detected in the indoor and outdoor air do not pose an immediate or short-term health risk to the residents. However, further air monitoring and evaluation will be conducted to evaluate potential long-term health risks to the housing residents.

It is important to note that the goal of the recent Navy investigation was to identify potential risks to housing residents from chemicals in the groundwater beneath Moffett Community Housing. The report concluded that residents are not at risk from the chemicals in groundwater. However, TCE and other air-borne contaminants were detected. It appears that these air-borne contaminants are not coming from ground water, but from other sources. Therefore, additional air monitoring is going to be conducted.

The Navy is currently working with United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, and the Army to plan for and conduct this additional investigation. The work plan, field work, and evaluation report will be completed over the next several months. The EPA's Draft Vapor Intrusion Guidance will be used in developing the work plan for the additional investigation.

Additionally, the Army and Navy are preparing a fact sheet and organizing an open house for the residents of Orion Park and Wescoat housing. This open house, scheduled for July/August, will give the housing residents an opportunity to review the information related to the previous and planned investigations and discuss their questions and concerns with the Army, Navy and regulatory agencies involved in the project. An overview of the open house will be provided at the July 10th Restoration Advisory Board meeting.

Also noteworthy, the EPA is currently investigating regional ambient air quality as part of its superfund program in Mountain View. In conjunction with EPA's efforts to reduce emissions of TCE in the Mountain View area, the Navy has recently modified its ground water treatment system (located on the former NAS Moffett Field) to completely eliminate VOC emissions, thereby improving local air quality.






