

# Lacking Lions?

LOCAL LIONS CLUB STRUGGLES TO BUILD MEMBERSHIP

If you didn't know there's a Lions Club in Mountain View, you're not alone.

The club, which formed in August of last year after six months of recruitment, still has only eight members. It takes 20 to be a fully chartered independent Lions club, so technically, the Mountain View Lions Club is actually the Mountain View branch of the Sunnyvale Lions Club.

"We think part of the problem is that it requires time to be a member, and many people don't want to commit to that," said Bob DeUnger, membership chair of the Sunnyvale Lions Club.

"We're looking for people who live in town or work in town who are interested in doing community service," said Hugh Donagher, a member of the Mountain View chapter. Though membership is by invitation only, Donagher said, "Anybody who's willing to work is welcome."

Members say the benefits of being a Lion go beyond the good feeling of doing public service. "Meetings typically involve breaking bread with your fellow members, getting to know each other, a sense of community. And it's a lot of fun," Donagher said.

The Mountain View Lions Club's first public service project is a book drive to benefit the Mountain View Public Library. It runs now through May 31. The book drive was conceived to help the library's Bookmobile program, which brings books to the homebound.

### PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD ON HANGAR #1 EE/CA

May 5, 2006 - June 5, 2006



The U.S. Navy, in cooperation with NASA, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board is requesting public comments on the engineering evaluation/cost analysis (EE/CA) for Hangar 1, located at the former NAS Moffett Field in Mountain View, Calif. The EE/CA will be available to the public on May 5, 2006.

The EE/CA summarizes the evaluation of 13 alternatives and describes the Navy's recommended alternative. The recommended alternative consists of complete demolition and off-site disposal of Hangar 1, with the historic resource mitigation of Historic American Engineering Record documentation (measured drawings, photos, oral history and interactive archive). The Hangar 1 site will also be marked to denote the size of the structure.

The recommended alternative provides the best solution because the contaminant source (the hangar siding and structure) would be completely controlled by removing the source from the site. Removing the hangar provides the highest degree of protection and will allow for future uses of the site and cleanup of nearby wetlands (Site 25). The recommended alternative satisfies all applicable or relevant and appropriate requirements (ARARs) when implemented in combination with the proposed historic mitigation measures.

**Public Comment Period** – The Navy is holding a 30-day public comment period from May 5, 2006 through June 5, 2006. After careful review and consideration of all public input, a decision will be made on the removal action.
