Carlmont grad), and her godparents Grant Keeler and Clara Perez Keeler," Barbara Stogner said. "The recipient would be one of the senior softball players at Carlmont."

The committee looked for student-athletes with a "spirit, zest for life and vivaciousness" similar to China's. Candidates submitted letters about themselves, their vision and what the scholarship would mean. There were 15-minute live interviews. Krutein received the scholarship over several other worthy candidates.

"Mimi's a great kid," Carlmont Coach Jim Liggett said. "She's one of our team captains and a leader by example. She did anything that was asked for. She has some of the same great qualities as China. Both are fun-loving kids with a great sense of humor, a love for the game of softball and they go along with everyone."

Carlmont is arguably the most dominant softball program in the state. Liggett has captured seven CCS titles and five second-place finishes during his career with the Scots, racking up over 800 wins. Both Krutein and China Stogner are recent multiyear star players.

Krutein played primarily in the outfield her first two years at Carlmont. This past season, she stepped in and caught 10-12 games when the team's regular catcher was injured. She also filled in at other places around the diamond to help Liggett's team, which Krutein and tri-captains Ashley Chinn and Katy Suko led to a 30-2-1 record and the CCS championship game. The previous year, the Scots finished 29-2 and reached the semifinals. China Stogner played first base at Carlmont and was one of the team's best hitters during the 1999 championship season and a solid year in 2000.

"We went to games this year and watched how they played and interacted with each other," Barbara Stogner said. "Mimi had the team attitude and was a good all-around cheerleader for the team. And she had the aspiration to become a nurse. China's experience in the hospital was such that she loved the doctors, yet the ones that really made a difference were the nurses. They don't get as much high pay or admiration. We thought it was noble that Mimi would choose to be a nurse. She's a wonderful girl."

Cal State San Marcos, a fairly new school in Southern California, has built one of the top nursing programs in the state. Krutein is excited about that and will also continue playing softball.

"My grandmother was a nurse," Krutein said. "I always gravitated to helping people and healing people. When I was young, I would put Band-Aids on cracks in the walls. This past year, I volunteered twice a week at Sequoia Hospital. I learned a lot and I like interacting with patients. Nurses show complete selflessness in dealing with patients."

Another fundraising event is Saturday's Relay for Life at Carlmont (10 a.m. Saturday until 10 a.m. Sunday), which will raise funds for the American Cancer Society and for the scholarship. There will also be a Bunco tournament on Sept. 23 at Casa de Flores in San Carlos to raise funds for future scholarships.


