when we played them at home," she said, referring to a 1-0 Point Loma victory in April.

Point Loma, a perfect 10-0 in league competition entering the contest, only needed to defeat second-place Serra to clinch the team's first league title in more than a decade. But Serra pitcher Shanel Gohsler was not about to yield to Point Loma. Gohsler showed why she was the 1994 All-Eastern League Player of the Year and one of the top pitchers again this year.

The underhand fireballer's pitches stymied Lady Pointer hitters and allowed only one hit. That hit, a two-out, top-of-the-seventh single by Larinda Souza, broke up Gohsler's bid for a no-hitter.

"I didn't even want to bat," Souza said. "No way did I want to be the last out of a no-hitter. After I hit the ball, all I kept thinking was to get to first base as quickly as possible."


The one hit and zero runs scored was Point Loma's poorest hitting output

of the season. Gohsler's assortment of pitches got much of the credit. "I tried to move the ball around and keep my curve up and away from right-handed batters," said Gohsler, whose rising fastball starts knee high and then crosses the plate at the letters.

The Serra pitcher said she wasn't upset to lose her no-hitter with one out remaining. "I don't care how many hits or runs I give up as long as we win," she said. Gohsler quickly shook off Souza's hit to get the next batter to pop out on the second pitch to end the game.

The game also marked the first loss for Lady Pointer pitcher Cathy Yamashiro, whose record is now 16-1. Yamashiro surrendered a season-high two runs on six hits. She has allowed only four runs all season.

Point Loma must defeat Patrick Henry in the season finale to clinch the title. With a loss, the team could finish in a three-way tie with Patrick Henry and Serra.
