NTC Board Reviews Cleanup Status

The Naval Training Center's Restoration Advisory Board (RAB) heard status reports on five cleanup sites during a meeting March 26.

The emphasis of the presentations was on methods used in the cleanup and what toxic materials were on site. All the sites discussed were in the final stages of cleanup with few remaining tasks before completion. The board members approved the status reviews with no objections.

The RAB was also shown a new public relations video produced by the NTC. RAB chairman, Phil Dyck, helped make the video in the hope of informing San Diego residents about the work being done by the board. The video gave a brief history of the NTC and the creation of the Base Realignment And Closing (BRAC) department. The video also covers the conversion process. This process includes site screening and development; environmental planning and clean-up; and final transfer of property.

The board was also informed that Dyck, acting BRAC chairman will be transferring to another position. Keith Foreman, current NTC Environmental Officer, replaced Dyck effective April 1.




