**ANALYSIS OF COMPREHENSIVE ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSE,
COMPENSATION, AND LIABILITY ACT (CERCLA) CONSTITUENT
ANALYSIS AT SITES DESIGNATED PETROLEUM-ONLY, NAVAL
STATION TREASURE ISLAND, SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA**

Dear Ms. Lee:

This letter is to confirm that nine Installation Restoration Program sites (04,06, 14, 15, 16, 19, 20, 11, and 25) at Naval Station Treasure Island have been found by the BRAC Cleanup Team and Remedial Project Managers to qualify for the CERCLA petroleum exclusion, based on the results of field investigations and data evaluation. The Navy has moved these nine sites from the Installation Restoration Program into the petroleum program. In order to ensure that potential CERCLA substances have not been overlooked or missed by sampling, the Department of Toxic Substances Control considers it imperative that the Regional Water Quality Control Board continue to monitor for CERCLA substances. These analytes include, but are not limited to, metals and chlorinated solvents that might have been commingled with the petroleum at the sites.

We therefore request that you allow us to review your sampling program for these nine sites to ensure that appropriate non-excluded constituents are evaluated.
