FINAL SITE 12 REMOVAL SITE EVALUATION AND ACTION MEMORANDUM,
FINAL CONSTRUCTION OVERSIGHT WORK PLAN, AND FINAL REMOVAL ACTION
WORK PLAN FOR LEAD - CONTAMINATED SOIL AT BUILDINGS 1207 AND 1209,
NAVAL STATION TREASURE ISLAND

The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) has reviewed the above listed documents that together comprise the Removal Action Work Plan (RAW) for Lead-Contaminated Soil at Site 12 near Buildings 1207 and 1209 in the residential area at the northern end of Treasure Island. As a result of this review, DTSC has determined that the Navy has adequately revised the documents, based on comments made on the draft documents, and that these documents satisfactorily meet the requirements of a RAW.

DTSC acknowledges that this RAW will only address lead contaminated soil and that other contaminants detected in the area near Buildings 1207 and 1209 will be addressed in the Site 12 Remedial Action Plan (RAP). Lead contaminated soil will be cleaned up to the pre-established cleanup goal of 400 milligrams per kilogram and verified through confirmation sampling. DTSC also acknowledges that lead contaminated soil that is left in place beneath structures and other infrastructure will also be addressed in the Site 12 RAP.
