FORMER NAVAL STATION TREASURE ISLAND, SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA –
NO FURTHER ACTION FOR SELECTED WASTEWATER LINES (FORCE MAIN)

Dear Mr. Forman:

The Department of Toxic Substances Control and the California Department Public Health (CDPH) have reviewed the *Final Scoping Survey Report, Radiological Investigation of Selected Wastewater Lines (Force Main), Radiological Surveys at Various Areas, Former Naval Station Treasure Island, San Francisco, California* (Final Report) dated August 15, 2016. CDPH provided comments on the draft of this Report on July 8, 2016. Navy responses were provided in the Responses to Comments (RTC) dated July 22, 2016.

The site covered by the Final Report includes the selected waste water lines (Force Main) located at the eastern section of the former Naval Station Treasure Island (NSTI), along Avenue M from California Avenue to the wastewater treatment plant. The site was classified as radiologically impacted in the 2014 Historical Radiological Assessment Technical Memorandum prepared for NSTI due to radiological chemicals that were used in buildings that contributed to the wastewater lines.

As presented in the Final Report, the results of the scoping surveys support the conclusion that the selected wastewater lines or force main is not radiologically contaminated. The Final Report stated that no further investigation is warranted, and the Navy requests CDPH approve a Recommendation of Radiological Unrestricted Release (RURR). Since no radiological contamination was found at the site, an RURR is not required from CDPH. Per the enclosed August 31, 2016 email, CDPH has no further comments on the Final Report. Therefore, DTSC concludes that No Further Action is required for the site.
