Subj: TRANSPORTATION/DISPOSAL OF ORDNANCE

1. On 4 March 1991, our Security Department discovered that eight pieces of ordnance had washed up on our shoreline. Based on the condition of the ordnance, we believe that these shells are between 25 to 30 years old. Although we had originally believed the shells to be inert, your explosive ordnance disposal team determined, during a site visit on 12 March 1991, that these armor piercing projectiles may be live.

2. As a result of this determination, we request transportation and disposal support from your activity. Ms. Ann Swope, of your environmental office, was notified on 1 April 1991 by Ms. Sherry McCahill, of my office, concerning disposal of this ordnance.
